 - A) Willem de Kooning, b. Netherlands 1904, to US in 20s, d. 1997
 - B) Franz Kline, b. PA 1910 1962
 - C) Robert Motherwell, b. CA 1915-1991
 - D) "second generation" New York School the problems of spontaneity & followers of de Kooning's "signature" style (Jack Tworkov, Joan Mitchell...)

II. "Field" Painting

- A) Mark Rothko (b. Marcus Rothkowitz in Russia, 1903, to US as child, suicide 1970)
- B) Barnett Newman (b. Baruch Newman in NY 1905, d. 1970)
- C) Ad Reinhardt (b. Adolf in 1913, d. 1967)
