## Homework 2: Islands, Barriers and Successive Cyclicity

- (10) \*Who did they leave [before meeting \_]?
- (11) \*Which book did John have [a friend [to whom to read \_]?
- (12) ??Which book did John announce [a plan [(for you) to read \_]?
