And it came to pass in the four hundred and eightieth year after the children of Israel had come out of the land of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month of Ziv, which *is* the second month, that he began to build the house of the LORD. Now the house which King Solomon built for the LORD, its length *was* **Sixty** cubits, its width **tWenty**, and its height **thirty** cubits. The vestibule in
